CITY ORDINANCES & POLICIES

ANIMALS

It is unlawful to permit any dog or cat to run at large in the City. Dogs that are not leashed shall be deemed to be running at large. Owners are responsible for the removal of any waste from such animals in public streets, sidewalks, alleys or any other public places. Dogs must be licensed with McHenry County Public Health Department. Dog licenses may be obtained by veterinarians at the time the rabies vaccination is given. The City of Harvard has adopted the State Statute pertaining to Vicious Dogs.

Dogs that are leashed and licensed shall be allowed within City park property provided that the person walking or exercising the dog shall be responsible for any damage done to the landscaping of any park and for the removal of any waste from said animals.

BRUSH PICKUP

Brush pickup in the City of Harvard is in the months of May, July and October. Pickup begins on the second Monday of these months and will continue until all wards have been picked up.

To be sure your brush is removed, please have all branches by the curb before pickup begins, but no earlier than one week ahead of time. All branches must be a minimum of three feet long, the longer the better. Please stack branches with the cut side to the street. Stumps, bushes, plants, leaves, or weeds will not be picked up by the City. The time limit for brush piles is 20 minutes. After 20 minutes the resident is charged \$125.00 an hour with a minimum charge of \$50.00.

Storm Damage brush should be put to the curb for pickup, the City does not pick up brush on private property.

BUILDING PERMITS

Building permits are required by the City of Harvard to construct new/old decks, sheds, etc. For more information, contact the Building Department at (815) 943-6468.

BURNING

The open burning of leaves or any other materials or substances is prohibited within the city limits, other than the preparation of food on a temporary or permanent fireplace grill.

CONTRACTOR'S LICENSE

Every tradesman, general contractor or subcontractor engaged in any kind of construction work, remodeling, repair, moving or demolition of buildings or structures or parts, services or equipment thereof, with in the City, shall be annually licensed by the City prior to rendering any such service. The license year will run from January 2 through January 1 of the following year. The annual license fee shall be \$75.00 and shall not be prorated or transferable. Application forms for the annual license are available from City Hall and will include, but not be limited to, evidence of sufficient liability insurance. A violation of any City ordinance shall be considered grounds for revocation of a license.

CURFEW

Except as provided in Section 26.02-C herein, it is unlawful for any person less than 17 years of age to be present at, in or upon any public assembly, building, place, street or highway at the following times:

1. Between 12:01 a.m. and 6 a.m. Saturday;
2. Between 12:01 a.m. and 6 a.m. Sunday; and
3. Between 11 p.m. on Sunday to Thursday, inclusive, and 6 a.m. on the following day.

For more information regarding exclusions to the curfew please contact City Hall.

DOWNTOWN PARKING

Two hour parking unless posted. No parking from 2:00 a.m. to 5:00 a.m. in the downtown area.

GARAGE SALE PERMIT

Garage sale permits may be picked up at City Hall (no charge). A limit of 2 per year.

GARBAGE/REFUSE

The City of Harvard has contracted with a private disposal firm to collect garbage in residential areas inside the city limits. Recycled glass, paper and aluminum are also collected on your regular garbage day. Call MDC for more information (815)-568-7242.

GRASS MOWING

Grass and weeds are to be mowed and kept under five inches tall. Clippings are not to be blown into the streets. Cleanup will be required.

GUN REGISTRATION

The State of Illinois requires mandatory registration of firearm owners. Applications for a Firearm Owners Identification Card may be picked up at the Police Department or sporting goods store. The Police Department will photograph applicants for a \$2.00 charge at which time the applicant is responsible for sending the form along with \$5.00 registration fee to the State of Illinois.

HUNTING LICENSE

A hunting license is required by state statute and can be obtained at any sporting goods store. Contact the Illinois Department of Conservation for specific regulations and season limitation.

HYDRANT FLUSHING

The Utilities Dept. will flush and test hydrants twice a year. Flushing helps the City clean the water main by removing sediment and rust deposits and allows the City to verify the condition of all the fire hydrants. Hydrant flushing may create rust and brown colored water. The water is safe to drink but will stain clothes washed in it. If you experience rusty water, let your faucet run until clear.

INOPERABLE VEHICLE OR JUNK CARS

It is unlawful for anyone in the city to keep, store, maintain or otherwise retain, on either public or private property and in public view, any inoperable or unlicensed motor vehicle or partially dismantled vehicle or junk car. Cars will be towed.

LEAF COLLECTION

The City has contracted with a private disposal service for the curbside collection of leaves in the fall in residential areas inside the city limits. Leaves are to be raked to the curb (not in the street). The schedule for leaf pickup varies from

year-to-year depending on weather conditions. Public Works does not pick up leaves.

LEGAL DRINKING AGE

The legal drinking age in Illinois is 21 for all alcoholic beverages.

OVERNIGHT PARKING

Parking is prohibited on all City streets between the hours of 2:00 and 5:00 AM.

PEDDLERS AND SOLICITORS

It is unlawful for any person to engage in business as a peddler or solicitor in a residential area of the City without first having obtained a license pursuant to City regulations. Contact City Hall.

RAFFLE LICENSE

Any non-profit organization interested in conducting a raffle must receive a license issued by the City. The completed application and \$10 fee should be submitted to the Mayor's office for approval, after which a license will be issued. Forms can be obtained at City Hall or at www.cityofharvard.org

SNOW EMERGENCY

A snow emergency shall exist within the City when two or more inches of snow has occurred, or whenever the Public Works Director or his designee declares that a snow emergency exists. The Director or his designee may declare a snow emergency at a time prior to an accumulation of two inches of snow if, in his judgment, the weather conditions are such that an early declaration of a snow emergency would promote the effective implementation of the City's snow removal plan. After a snow emergency comes into existence or is declared, it shall continue until such time as the Public Works Director or his designee declares its termination.

No Parking: When a snow emergency exists, it shall be unlawful for any vehicle to be parked on any public street or parking lot in the City. Any vehicle in violation of this provision will be ticketed and towed away by or at the discretion of the City. The owner of the vehicle, as well as the

person who caused said vehicle to stop, stand or park, shall be individually liable for all expenses incurred as a result of towing said vehicle away. Your cooperation by parking off of the street during any snowfall, even when less than two inches, will make the task of clearing the streets more efficient and safer.

When clearing your own driveway or parking lot, please do not push or blow snow into the street, across the street, or onto any other property. Pushing snow into the street can leave windrows in the street that result in traffic hazards, add to icing problems, and also cause problems for your neighbors cleaning a driveway and pushing snow across the street onto their property on the opposite side. Please respect your neighbor and also help to keep our streets safer by avoiding this problem.

SNOW REMOVAL**SPECIAL REQUESTS**

The Department of Public Works maintains approximately 40 center line miles of streets and several public parking lots for snow removal. In order for this work to be completed in a timely manner, it is necessary for each truck to follow a specific pre-planned route. It is not possible for the City to accept and complete snow removal on a specific street on a request basis. The Department of Public Works does remain in direct communication with both the Harvard Police Department and Harvard Fire Protection District during snow events. If the assistance of a snow plow is needed to respond to an emergency location, the truck will be dispatched by those emergency departments.

MAINTENANCE OF TREES IN RIGHT OF WAY

The DPW is responsible for the maintenance, trimming, and removal of all trees located within the street right of way. To request

trimming or removal of a tree within the right of way, please contact the DPW. Trees will only be trimmed if they are deemed to be a hazard.

Residents may be permitted to trim or remove trees within the street right of way subject to approval. Contact the Community Development Dept.

WATER BILLING

Water and sewer bills for all properties served by the City are issued to the property owner every two months and are prepared based on water meters installed at each property. These meters record the amount of water used in units of 100 cubic feet (100 cubic feet of water equals approximately 750 gallons), and the meters are read by City employees every two months. The reading from the water meter is also used to calculate the sewer bill for the property. If you have any questions or would like to arrange for direct payments from your checking/savings account, contact the water billing clerk at (815) 943-6468 or at murillo@cityofharvard.org.

WATER METER REPLACEMENTS AND REPAIRS

The DPW provides maintenance and replacement services for all water meters. Meter repairs and meter replacements will be performed by the City at no cost to the customer. The building owner is responsible for the maintenance and repairs of the plumbing pipe at the meter and also to provide working shut off valves at the meter. Many of the older style of water meters require the reading to be taken inside of the home or building. This can be an inconvenience to the property owner, or if no one is home, requires the customer to take their own meter reading and return it to the City. The City offers, free of charge replacement of these older style water meters. A new meter will be installed that includes an outside reading device, which eliminates the need for the City employee to go inside of the building to take the reading. 

It's Harvard's unofficial reunion weekend and Illinois' longest continuously running festival

Harvard became the self-proclaimed "Milk Center of the World" when at one time there were as many as seven dairy companies within a 15-mile radius of Harvard. Those dairies produced more milk than anywhere else in the United States.

In the spring of 1942, a local war effort was underway in the Stateline area to increase milk and food production for our servicemen in World War II. At a small, civic celebration, which included a gathering of all the folks in the Harvard area, friends and neighbors, both city and farm dwellers, pledged to return a year later during June Dairy Month to renew their efforts to sell war bonds and support this area's war involvement.

That gathering now attracts over 100,000 visitors to Harvard over a two-week period in late May and early June.

The community has changed since the street dance and hay wagon days, however Harvard Milk Days still builds itself around a huge parade on Ayer Street. Over the years, world-class athletes to nationally recognized politicians have led the Milk Days Parade. Mickey Mouse, the Budweiser Clydesdales, the Jesse White Tumblers, and many, many more famous people have graced the Milky Way.

While the essence of Harvard Milk Days remains a salute to Americana, and our heritage, Harvard Milk Days is also a huge enterprise. Hundreds of volunteers work year-round to scout talent for entertainment, contract bands and drum corps for the parade and arrange for new features for the Milk Days festival grounds.

While some events, like the Mini Tractor Pulls and hot air balloon launches, are new, several favorites remain.

Harvard Milk Days' Prince and Princess contest is famous for the crepe paper costumes worn by the contestants. Big Wheel and Bed Races close Ayer Street for hometown fun, and the Milk Drinking Contest hosted by Dean Foods always draws a crowd.

We invite you to take part in all of our activities, whether it is crowning royalty, cheering on your favorite entry in a competitive event, or just to sit in the shade and enjoy our two-hour parade along that famous strip of street known worldwide as the "Milky Way."



The McHenry County Conservation District was established by voter referendum in 1971. Its purpose, as defined by state statutes, is three-fold:

Preservation of open space—Over 25,000 acres have been preserved by the District, providing protection for prairies, savannas and wetlands.

Education—Programs and workshops teach children and adults ways to respect and enjoy their natural surroundings. Two popular activities include the Festival of the Sugar Maples at Coral Woods Conservation Area in March and Hooked on Fishing at Rush Creek and The Hollows in June.

Recreation—District sites throughout the county offer a wide range of recreational opportunities, including hiking, horseback riding, permit camping, biking, canoeing, fishing and picnicking.

For more information about the Conservation District, its sites and services, visit MCCDistrict.org or find us on Facebook. District Administrative Offices are located at 18410 U.S. Highway 14 between Harvard and Woodstock, open Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., (815) 338-6223. Another great source of information about the Conservation District and its programs is Landscapes, the District's free seasonal magazine. If you would like to receive

Landscapes on a regular basis by mail or e-notification, contact the District to have your name added to the mailing list.

Four of the District's sites can be found in the Harvard area:

RUSH CREEK CONSERVATION AREA

is located on McGuire Road, east of Route 14. It has over 726 acres of forest, wetlands and meadows providing habitat for a wide variety of bird and animal life. Visitors can hike interpretive nature trails, fish the pond for bass or bluegill, bird watch or ride along the horse trails. The camping area can accommodate large groups and picnic facilities are available. Winter activities include ice fishing and cross-country skiing. Water and sanitary facilities are located onsite.

BECK'S WOODS

lies on either side of Route 173, with entrances on Pagles Road or Maxon Road. It has been a public gathering place since 1872, when Isaiah and Elizabeth Beck left the pasture gate unlocked for anyone who wanted to fish or picnic. Today the 283-acre site offers areas for picnics or camping under the oak trees, while the Piscasaw River tempts anglers with bluegill, trout and small mouth bass. Water and sanitary facilities are available.

STONE MILL TRAIL

This 1.5 mile trail takes users from Maxon Road in Chemung, along Ramer Road to Lawrence Road near Milky Way Park in Harvard. Historically, a saw mill, grist mill and then a Flour mill all existed on the Chemung end of the trail dating back to 1845. The Stone Mill trail provides a great recreational amenity to these two rural towns and provides a safe means of travel.

HIGH POINT CONSERVATION AREA

is located on Reese Road between Rt 173 and Hebron Rd. Notably, this 253 acre site contains the highest glaciated point above sea level in the state. A 1 mile looped nature trail provides scenic views of the surrounding landscape as it travels through an oak and hickory woodland.



The Harvard Fire Protection District proudly protects 16,000 people living within 108 square mile response area. We operate out of one station located at 502 S. Eastman St. Our Fire District is a public department whose employees are both paid and paid-on-call. Our insurance rating is a 6 within the city limits and a 9 in the rural areas.

The Harvard Fire Protection District operates with a three person board of trustees, one Fire Chief, three Battalion Chiefs, three Captains, three Lieutenants and 44 employees. The employees are certified to a minimum of Firefighter II and EMT-Basic.

The station is staffed in two 12 hour shifts, seven days a week, 365 days a year. The day-time shift is now staffed with three personnel consisting of at least one FF/Paramedic and two FF/EMT-B's. At night the station is staffed at minimum with one FF/Paramedic and one FF/EMT-B. Also during the evening shift one of the District's officers will respond as a shift commander from home and three FF's will respond from home for all engine responses.


The Fire District is very active in public education for all ages along with inspection and pre-plans of businesses and new construction within the district. The Fire District also offers CPR and First Aid classes along with public education appearances to any organization that requests us.

The Fire District is dispatched by the Harvard Police Department. The McHenry County Sheriffs Department serves as the back-up dispatch.

The HFPD responds to and has the ability to handle numerous types of incidents, including: fire suppression, EMS, extrication from auto accidents, farm rescue, high-level rescue, below-grade rescue, water rescue and hazardous material spills. Our main hospital transport is Mercy Harvard Hospital.

The HFPD employees also actively train in both Fire and EMS operations at least twice per month to provide the best and most professional service possible for those we protect. Our EMS training is supplied to us by our EMS System, Rock River EMS out of Rockford Memorial Hospital.

A Bright Start for a Brighter Tomorrow


Building opened in 1953

Washington School houses the District's At-Risk Pre-Kindergarten (Pre-K), Early Childhood Education (ECE). The Washington staff is dedicated to giving the children of Harvard a strong start in their career as life-long learners.

The half-day Pre-K Program serves three- and four-year-old children who have been identified through a screening process as being at risk of academic failure. The Pre-K staff works closely with the children to develop language, social and fine & gross motor skills to ensure success in kindergarten and beyond.

The Early Childhood Education Program serves three- to six-year olds who have special education needs. Early intervention is key to future success. These children are served in classrooms that provide small group and one-on-one instruction that meets each child's individual needs as determined by his Individual Education Plan (IEP).

The staff of Washington School is determined to give all young children the skills and confidence they need to be successful lifelong learners.



RICHARD D. CROSBY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Building opened in 2010

Richard D. Crosby Elementary School is the first new school in District 50 in 48 years. This two-story, kid-focused building houses the district's kindergarten through 3rd grade classes. Classrooms are designed in grade-level neighborhoods or groups, centered around an open Discovery Center for each grade. Classrooms are provided with technology tools that help teachers to keep learning interesting and engaging. The expanded library, computer rooms, auditorium style reading space, Discovery Centers, and small group areas provide teachers with a variety of learning environments in which to engage their students.

Crosby Elementary provides the community with community meeting spaces including a community meeting room, a multi-purpose room and the gymnasium which includes bleachers and a stage.



JEFFERSON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Meeting the Needs of All Learners

Building opened in 1954

Jefferson Elementary School houses fourth and fifth grades. Jefferson is a child-centered school with a mix of veteran and energetic new staff. Jefferson students work to live up to the Jefferson pledge "to do their best and respect others."

Jefferson teachers work to build character and to ensure students feel positive about themselves. The related service staff supports students with special needs or those who need help adapting to a new school. Jefferson motivates students with unique activities like reading rallies, a climbing wall, a pond and nature area for environmental learning, Red Ribbon Week activates, and attendance competitions.

Jefferson is a recognized regional leader in PBIS, a system that encourages positive student behaviors and living up to expectations. Early intervention programs are available for students in order to improve and strengthen academic skills such as reading and math. Jefferson Elementary School also provides a continuum of special education services such as resource- and self-contained classrooms.



HARVARD HIGH SCHOOL

Building Opened in 1921

"By knowing, valuing, and inspiring ALL learners, we will prepare graduates for a quality life after high school."

The high school mission is to prepare students for life after high school, whether it is 2 or 4 year post-secondary education, technical school, the military or moving directly into the work force.

Harvard High School offers challenging honors courses at all levels and Advanced Placement (AP) classes including; AP Calculus, AP Spanish, AP Government, and AP American History. Dual credit courses (both college and high school credit) in cooperation with McHenry County College (MCC) are also offered. We are especially proud of our LINK Crew, a group of upper classmen whose purpose is the mentoring of incoming freshmen and transfer students. Extra-curricular activities such as the National Honor Society, Interact, History club, Tri-M, FFA, Scholastic Bowl, the Accounting Bowl, and Operation "Click" enhance academic instruction for academically-focused students.

The Career and Technical Education (CTE) curricula prepare students for careers in business, family and consumer science, industrial technology, agriculture, or the military. Dual credit is available in collaboration with MCC for several areas of career interest including but not limited to; automotive technology, early childhood development, Internet

The high school guidance department offers development training and resources to help students choose careers, colleges, tech schools and obtain financial aid.

Harvard High School competes in the prestigious Big Northern Conference where students can participate in sports, student government, instrumental and choral music, and other extra-curricular activities. Additionally, the Hornets have represented themselves well in state completion bringing home nine Illinois High School Association state tournament trophies including two state championships.

Harvard Junior High School houses sixth through eighth grade students in a departmentalized junior high school setting.





If you happen to be near Harvard, Illinois on the first weekend in June, you might find yourself enjoying the annual "Milk Days" celebration. Milk Days is Harvard's way of honoring the important contributions of the agricultural community and the chance to tell the rest of the world that Harvard is a good place to live. It is a time of revelry, reunions and remembrances. People from all over the area join in the week's festivities which include a beauty pageant, a talent show, tractor pulls, farm tours, bed races, a special kid's parade and, of course, the big Milk Day Parade. Family and friends who have left Harvard 'come home' for the weekend and family reunions abound. And as the bands march along the "Milky Way," they trek past streets with names that remember Harvard's past.

Diggins Street is named for one of the earliest families to settle in Harvard. Wesley Diggins came to this area in 1827, built a log cabin that served as home and trading post, and encouraged other members of his family to join him. An explorer and adventurer at heart, Diggins eventually moved west to California and sold his property to a man named Blackman. A few years later, William Hart bought government land and began to build his homestead. Hart dreamed of developing a small village called "Sumner," but somehow his plans didn't work out as well as he expected.

Harvard, as a real town, became a reality primarily because of a man named Elbridge Gerry Ayer. Elbridge Ayer and his wife Mary left their home in Massachusetts and headed west in 1854. In 1855, Mr. Ayer bought four hundred acres of land in the Harvard area. Ayer watched with interest the growth of the railroad. He heard about how William B. Ogden, John Wentworth, George Randolph and others had envisioned Chicago as the greatest city in Illinois and sought to make it so by making it a railway center. In 1856, Ayer and two other railway enthusiasts, John Page and Henry Eastman, mapped out plans for a town and set out to win a contract to build a section of railway between Centerville (which is now Woodstock, Illinois) and the newly

incorporated town of Harvard - which was named after Ayer's ancestral home. The rail link was part of William Ogden's Chicago, St. Paul and Fond du Lac Railroad which later became the Chicago and North Western Railroad.

man in Chicago. By 1880, Harvard had grown to 1600 people. It was the place to buy groceries, clothing, medicine, furniture and tools. By the turn of the century the town bustled with wagon makers, barbers, dentists, doctors,

and became Federal Route 14. A former harness shop began selling Maxwell cars and a few years later a Ford dealership opened on Ayer Street. Today Harvard's business community is a blend of the past and the present.

Most local people agree that the best thing about Harvard is the people. Harvardites pride themselves on their resourcefulness and community spirit. They were the first town in the county to build a hospital, the first to build their own library building (in 2001 Harvard was blessed with a new, state of the art library) and the first to have a bank. We have also received as of 2001 a new state of the art aquatic center. The volunteer Fire/Rescue Department are a constant source of community pride.

2006 marked a historic milestone for the City of Harvard as we celebrated the Sesquicentennial Anniversary of the founding of our community. The Harvard Sesquicentennial Committee was formed in the fall of 2005 to plan and make preparations for the upcoming year. Local historian, Margaret Kistler, spearheaded the writing of a book, "Harvard: 150 Years" which is for sale at Harvard City Hall, the Chamber of Commerce, Harvard Diggins Library, the Historical Society and several businesses. Cost is \$7.00.

When the Chicago and North Western announced plans to build a routing center in the area, Ayer determined that it should be built in Harvard which then had a population of 250.


Ayer, Page and Eastman offered the railroad free land for the routing center in exchange for a stipulation that all passenger trains stop in Harvard. The railroad agreed and Harvard entered its railroad era. The railroad brought many jobs and opportunities. Ayer, for example, built a three story hotel next to the railroad tracks. The hotel's dining room could serve 150 people at a time. Ayer's son, Edward E. Ayer, made his fortune producing railroad ties and became a prominent

a hospital, two banks, an insurance agency, billiard parlor and saloons. A pickle factory with a 30,000 bushel capacity began operating in 1883 and by 1885 nearly half of the

small cheese factories in the county were located in Harvard.

Harvard now has over 8,000 people. The town, like most towns, has changed over the years. By 1916, the golden age of railroading was fading in the light of rising interest in a newer mode of transportation

- the automobile. The railroad diminished in importance, although Harvard residents still ride the Chicago and Northwestern line into Chicago and other towns along the way. By 1927, the gravel road that ran north and south out of Harvard had been cemented over

HISTORY OF HARVARD



Numerous special events were held throughout the year to commemorate our 150th birthday including an Antique Fashion Show, featuring fashions from the 1850's to the 1970's held at the Harvard Moose Lodge; a Community Church Service during Milk Days Weekend; a Cemetery Walk at Mt. Auburn Cemetery; the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Traveling Wall and The Coalition Memorial at Harvard Diggins Library; a World War II Re-enactment held at Lion's Park and a USO Dance held at the Stratford Banquet Hall. The final tribute was the re-signing of the Original Plat of Harvard/150th Birthday Party held on November 25, 2006, at the Harvard Moose Lodge, exactly 150 years to the day when the original plat was recorded. A time capsule was buried at Milky Way Park on May 25th, 2007, to be opened in the

year 2056.

Our community continued to grow during 2008 and 2009, despite a challenging economy. Walmart opened a 150,000 square foot SuperCenter on McGuire Road and was soon followed by new Advanced Auto, Walgreens and Tractor Supply locations. This set the stage for continued retail growth as the economy recovers.

The City of Harvard completed a major streetscape project in downtown Harvard during 2008, which featured new sidewalks, crosswalks, lamps and other furnishings, including planters and benches along Ayer Street. The project was considered to be a successful effort by all and downtown Harvard is well prepared for new businesses and community events.

The name Harmilda is derived from Harvard Milk Days (Har-mil-da). Harvard Milk Days was begun by the Greater Harvard Area Chamber of Commerce in 1942 to honor area farmers and to sell war bonds. It was such a hit that it has continued and is the longest continuous running festival in the state of Illinois.

Harmilda was first erected by the Jones brothers in 1966 when Harvard had the reputation of being the "Milk Center of the World." Then, more than one million pounds of milk would travel through our community during the course of one day. Harmilda was placed atop a pedestal in the center of town at the five points intersection and soon became the beloved town mascot.

In 1991 IDOT offered Harvard \$650,000 to widen the intersection but the people of Harvard did not want their mascot moved from her 25-year home. Media from all over the country picked up the story and Harvard and Harmilda found themselves in the limelight. Plans for the road construction were put on hold until a solution could be found for Harmilda, whose tradition and history continued to pull the community together.

Three years passed and an agreement was reached. The Greater Harvard Area Chamber of Commerce donated their land at the corner of the five points to the city of Harvard to provide a home for Harmilda.

In June of 1994, Richard Hermonson donated his time, crew and machines in the demolition of the old chamber building that the Chamber had purchased in 1967 as one of the first buildings owned by a Chamber in the state of Illinois. Many calls, of course, came in with folks wondering where the Chamber had gone. The City of Harvard provided the Chamber with a temporary home for 15 months.

Shortly after the Chamber building was torn down Harmilda was removed from her pedestal and placed in storage so IDOT could widen the five points intersection. People who travel through Harvard wondered where the fiberglass Holstein had gone. The City of Harvard has developed a park on the old Chamber building property.

In September 2012, with the help of volunteers, the chamber moved to its current location at 36 N. Ayer St. Suite #1.

GREATER HARVARD AREA HISTORICAL SOCIETY


The Greater Harvard Area Historical Society is located at 308 N. Hart St. and is in its 30th year of existence. In 1989, the Society was able to purchase the old St. Paul Lutheran Church building from the Presbyterian Church, enabling the Society to have a permanent home. Education is a main concern of the Society. Tours for school children and other groups are available throughout the year. Arrangements can be made by calling the museum at (815) 943-6141 or the museum curator at (815) 943-3561. Harvard history books are

available for purchase at the museum, Harvard Chamber of Commerce, or through museum members. Many other reference books and historical documents are available for research at the museum. Popular special exhibits from the museum collection are Harvard High School class pictures, the history of Milk Day celebrations, Starline products and catalogs, and a variety of antique clothing, farm and household items.

An ongoing mission of the museum is the plaquing of historic sites in the area. The Society is also interested in obtaining Harvard family

histories and in seeking out area businesses and farms that have been operating for more than 100 years.

The Society is supported by memberships, contributions from businesses, banks, Township governments and individual memorials and gifts. The museum is open from May through October on Sundays from 1:30 to 4:00 p.m. and on Wednesdays from 9:30 to noon or by appointment. Monthly programs on topics from Harvard and area history are held in the summer. Speakers and historical programs can be provided on request.





Visit the Harvard Diggins Public Library and enjoy a warm welcome to the Harvard community's center for learning, creating and imagining. Located in the recreational campus that includes the playground, sledding hill, swimming pool, Food Pantry, Senior Center and Lion's Park, the library offers books, DVD's, CD's, audio books, and magazines for checkout. The library's collection is not limited to print materials only. Digital books, audiobooks, and magazines are available for use on smart phones, tablets and computers with the touch of a finger from the library's website, www.harvard-diggins.org.

Library cardholders may access the library's collection and that of over 130 libraries in the PrairieCat consortium from the library's website 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Cardholders may search the catalog, place requests, and view and renew items checked out. As a member of PrairieCat and the Reaching Across Illinois Library System (RAILS), the library loans and borrows materials from other libraries widely.

Internet service is available on the library's public workstations as well as through the library's wi-fi. A local history area offers information about Harvard and the surrounding communities. Harvard newspapers from the late 1800's to 1986 have been digitized and are available for browsing from the 'Harvard Newspapers' link on the library's website.

The library's newsletter showcases the events and activities offered for all ages. It is available at the library and also on the library's homepage, www.harvard-diggins.org. Most events open to the community are offered at no cost. Quiet study space is available in the library's two study rooms overlooking the wildflower garden. The larger community meeting room, named the Burbank Room after local artist E.A. Burbank, is the site for most of the library's programming events.

Several special collections are found at the library and may be viewed during regular library hours. An early Harvard resident, Harriet Ayer Towne, gave her extensive butterfly

collection to the library in 1918. The collection is housed in the Local History room. Artwork by Harvard's most famous native artist, E. A. Burbank is on permanent display in the Burbank Room. The library also owns a collection of the Harvard Milk Day posters including the original painting for the first Milk Day poster, titled 'Morning Milk' by Daniel Barrett (Daniel Armour).

Harvard Diggins Library is a municipal library and tax money for its support is collected on property within the city limits of Harvard. City of Harvard residents may obtain

a library card at no additional cost. Persons living outside the city limits, in a non-taxed area, may purchase a nonresident library card for a fee calculated to reflect the average cost paid by a Harvard family. Both resident and nonresident cards may be used at most public libraries throughout the state of Illinois. Proof of address is required for registration.

Recent programs launched include Entrepreneurial Agriculture, Physical Therapist Assistant, Paralegal Studies, and Mobile Design and Development.

MCC has seen an enrollment of nearly 7,500 students taking over 58,000 credit hours in Fall 2019. That made MCC the only Illinois community college with a consecutive three-year increase in enrollment. MCC is passionate about finding accessible and significant approaches to supporting the Harvard community, as evident through a variety of programs and services provided in Harvard:

- College credit courses offered onsite at Harvard High School (www.mchenry.edu/harvard)
- MCC in Harvard open house program/event offered for the past two years
- Upward Bound program for students at Harvard High School for the past two years (www.mchenry.edu/upward) through a Federal grant, the MCC Bound program at Harvard High School assists students, grades 9 through 12, in completing high school and pursuing a college degree. The program provides an array of support services and resources, so students may be prepared and successfully access postsecondary opportunities. Program services are free for Upward Bound students and are offered during and after school.
- Free Tax Preparation (VITA Tax Clinic) (www.mchenry.edu/vita)
- Limited dual credit programming
- Strong partnership with the City of Harvard and the McHenry County Economic Development Corporation on new business development.

The Harvard Swimming Pool is open from June to August. The 7,000 sq. ft. pool is a handicapped accessible zero depth pool with a capacity for 422 people. Features include a water slide and a diving board. Don't miss the shallow end features (the raindrop, tumble buckets and the tulip shower). Also available are a picnic area, as well as a 5,680 sq. ft bath house, and concession stand. Pool passes and swimming lessons are available. The pool is available for private parties. The pool is located next to Lions Park and Jaycee/McFarlin Field and is accessible via Brown Street and also Galvin Parkway. Details on swimming lessons & pool hours/rates will be available on the city's website: www.cityofharvard.org by May 1, 2022.

Lions Park

Lions Park is located in the pool complex area accessible from Galvin Parkway off Rte. 173 East and also Brown Street. Lions Park includes the Harvard swimming pool, picnic grounds, and playground equipment for all ages and a pedestrian path. One shelter and restroom facilities are also available. A lighted sledding hill is also located in Lions Park. Parking for the sledding hill can be accessed from Harvard Hills Road. Future plans for Lions Park includes cross-country skiing.

**Moose Athletic Field**

Moose Athletic Field is located off West Diggins. It is the home of the Harvard Boys League. The park holds 2 baseball diamonds and a concession stand open during games. Restroom facilities are also available.

Northfield Park

Northfield Park is accessible by Northfield Avenue via Route 14 at the north end of Harvard. It has a playground for small children and restroom facilities it also sports our new tennis courts. Future plans for Northfield Park include picnic grounds, a pedestrian path, and ball fields.

Park Pointe Park

Park Pointe Park is accessible from Galvin Parkway via East Route 173. A parking lot is also located off Dewey Street. Park Pointe Park

offers a pedestrian path, fishing pier, and bird watching.

Milky Way Park

Milky Way Park is accessible from Lawrence Road via West Route 173 and West Diggins Street. It is the home of Harvard Youth Soccer and holds six soccer fields. It also includes baseball and softball diamonds, 1 football field, an outdoor fitness center, pedestrian path, picnic grounds, and playground. Shelter and restroom facilities are also available. Milky Way Park is the permanent location for Harvard Milk Day grounds.

**Mary D. Ayer Park**

Mary D. Ayer Park is located at Park & Washington off Ayer Street and close to Washington School. It includes picnic grounds, basketball courts, and playground equipment. Mary D. Ayer Park also has a shelter.

**McFarlin Field**

McFarlin Field is located next to the Lions Park and swimming pool complex. It is the home of Harvard Educational & Recreational Softball (HERS) leagues. It holds three softball diamonds and a concession stand open during the girls softball games. A shelter is also available.

Park Hours

All parks are open dawn to dusk with the exception of McFarlin Field and Moose Athletic Field. These parks remain open during games. The sledding hill at Lions Park is open until 10:00 pm during sledding season. Park shelters are available for public use by filling out an application to reserve a shelter. 
