ANIMALS

It is unlawful to permit any dog or cat to run at large in the City. Dogs that are not leashed shall be deemed to be running at large. Owners are responsible for the removal of any waste from such animals in public streets, sidewalks, alleys or any other public places. Dogs must be licensed with McHenry County Public Health Department. Dog licenses may be obtained by veterinarians at the time the rabies vaccination is given. The City of Harvard has adopted the State Statute pertaining to Vicious Dogs.

Dogs that are leashed and licensed shall be allowed within City park property provided that the person walking or exercising the dog shall be responsible for any damage done to the landscaping of any park and for the removal of any waste from said animals.

BURNING

The open burning of leaves or any other materials or substances is prohibited within the city limits, other than the preparation of food on a temporary or permanent fireplace grill.

CURFEW

Except as provided in Section 26.02-C herein, it is unlawful for any person less than 17 years of age to be present at, in or upon any public assembly, building, place, street or highway at the following times:

Between 12:01 a.m. and 6 a.m. Saturday; Between 12:01 a.m. and 6 a.m. Sunday; and Between 11 p.m. on Sunday to Thursday, inclusive, and 6 a.m. on the following day.

For more information regarding exclusions to the curfew please contact City Hall.

PARKING

Downtown Parking:
Two-hour parking unless posted.

Overnight Parking:

Parking is prohibited on all City streets between the hours of 2:00 and 5:00 a.m.

GARBAGE/REFUSE

The City of Harvard has contracted with a private disposal firm to collect

garbage in residential areas inside the city limits. Recycled glass, paper, and aluminum are also collected on your regular garbage day. Call Marengo Disposal at 815-568-7274 for more information.

GRASS MOWING

Grass and weeds are to be mowed and kept under five inches tall. Clippings are not to be blown into the streets. Cleanup will be required.

HUNTING LICENSES

A hunting license is required by state statute and can be obtained at any sporting goods store. Contact the Illinois Department of Conservation for specific regulations and season limitations.

INOPERABLE VEHICLE OR JUNK CAR

It is unlawful for anyone in the city to keep, store, maintain or otherwise retain, on either public or private property and in public view, any inoperable or unlicensed motor vehicle or partially dismantled vehicle or junk car. Cars will be towed.

LEAF COLLECTION

The City has contracted with a private disposal service for the curbside collection of leaves in the fall in residential areas inside the city limits. Leaves are to be raked to the curb (not in the street). The schedule for leaf pickup varies from year-to-year depending on weather conditions.

PEDDLERS & SOLICITORS

It is unlawful for any person to engage in business as a peddler or solicitor in a residential area of the City without first having obtained a license pursuant to City regulations. Contact City Hall for applications.

MAINTENANCE OF TREES IN RIGHT OF WAY

The DPW is responsible for the maintenance, trimming, and removal of all trees located within the street right of way. To request trimming or removal of a tree within the right of way, please contact the DPW. Trees will only be trimmed if they are deemed to be a hazard.

Residents may be permitted

to trim or remove trees within the street right of way subject to approval. Contact the Community Development Dept. at 815 943-6468 to obtain a no-charge permit.

VEHICLE STICKERS

Vehicle Stickers are not required in the City of Harvard.

BRUSH PICK-UP

Brush pickup in the City of Harvard is in the months of May, July and October. Pickup begins on the second Monday of these months and will continue until all wards have been picked up.

To be sure your brush is removed, please have all branches by the curb before pickup begins, but no earlier than one week ahead of time. All branches must be a minimum of three feet long, the longer the better. Please stack branches with the cut end to the street. Stumps, bushes, plants, leaves, or weeds will not be picked up by the City. The time limit for brush piles is 20 minutes. After 20 minutes the resident is charged \$125.00 an hour with a minimum charge of \$50.00.

Storm damage brush should be put to the curb for pickup; the City does not pick up brush on private property.

BUILDING PERMITS

Building permits are required by the City of Harvard to construct decks, sheds, fences, etc. For more information, contact the Building Department at (815) 943-6468.

CONTRACTORS

Every tradesman, general contractor, or subcontractor engaged in any kind of construction work, remodeling, repair, moving, or demolition of buildings or structures or parts, services, or equipment thereof, within the City, shall be annually licensed by the City prior to rendering any such service. The license year will run from January 2 through January 1 of the following year. The annual license fee shall be \$75 and shall not be prorated or transferable. Application forms for the annual license are available from City Hall and will include, but not be limited to, evidence of sufficient liability insurance. A violation of any City ordinance shall be considered grounds for revocation of a license.

GARAGE SALE PERMITS

All garage sales in the City require Garage Sale Permits from City Hall. There is no charge for the permit. Garage sales are limited to two per year by street address.

FIREARM OWNERS IDENTIFICATION (FOID)

To legally possess firearms or ammunition, Illinois residents must have a Firearm Owners Identification (FOID) card, which is issued by the Illinois State Police to any qualified applicant. Applications may be picked up at the Harvard Police Department or found online at www.ispsfb.com.

Hydrant Flushing:

Hydrant Flushing begins April 15 as the weather permits. This will be a complete distribution system flushing and will last 3-4 weeks. When City Staff is flushing hydrants, your water may become discolored. We recommend letting your faucets run until the water clears up. This should only take a few minutes. It is not recommended to wash white clothes during the time we are in your ward. Hydrant flushing signs will be out and we will let City Hall know what ward we are in each day.

LEGAL DRINKING AGE

The legal drinking age in Illinois is 21 for all alcoholic beverages.

RAFFLE LICENSES

Any non-profit organization interested in conducting a raffle must receive a license issued by the City. The completed application and \$10 fee must be submitted to the Mayor's office for approval, after which a license will be issued. Applications can be obtained at City Hall or at www.cityofharvard.org.

SNOW EMERGENCY**Snow Removal:**

A snow emergency shall exist within the City when two or more inches of snow has occurred, or whenever the Public Works Director or their designee declares that a snow emergency exists. The Director or his designee may declare a snow emergency at a time prior to an accumulation of two inches of snow if, in their judgment, the weather conditions are such that an early declaration of a snow emergency would promote the effective

implementation of the City's snow removal plan. After a snow emergency comes into existence or is declared, it shall continue until such time as the Public Works Director or their designee declares its termination.

No Parking:

When a snow emergency exists, it shall be unlawful for any vehicle to be parked on any public street or parking lot in the City. Any vehicle in violation of this provision will be ticketed and towed away by or at the direction of the City. The owner of the vehicle, as well as the person who caused said vehicle to stop, stand, or park, shall be individually liable for all expenses incurred as a result of towing said vehicle away. Your cooperation by parking off the street during any snowfall, even when less than two inches, will make the task of clearing the streets more efficient and safer.

Depositing Snow:

When clearing your own driveway or parking lot, please do not push or blow snow into the street, across the street, or onto any other property. Pushing snow into the street can leave windrows in the street that result in traffic hazards, add to icing problems, and cause problems for your neighbor across the street. Each year, the City receives several complaints from property owners about neighbors cleaning a driveway and pushing snow across the street onto their property on the opposite side. Please respect your neighbor and help to keep our streets safer by avoiding this problem.

Snow Removal Special Requests:

The Department of Public Works maintains approximately 40 center line miles of streets and several public parking lots for snow removal. For this work to be completed in a timely manner, it is necessary for each truck to follow a specific pre-planned route. It is not possible for the City to accept and complete snow removal on a specific street on a request basis. The Department of Public Works does remain in direct communication with both the Harvard Police Department and Harvard Fire Protection District during snow events. If the assistance of a snowplow is needed to respond to an emergency location, the truck will be dispatched by those emergency departments.

WATER AND SEWER

Billing:

Water and sewer bills for all properties served by the City are issued to the property owner every two months and are prepared based on water meters installed at each property. These meters record the amount of water used in units of 100 cubic feet (100 cubic feet of water equals approximately 750 gallons), and the meters are read by City employees every two months. The reading from the water meter is also used to calculate the sewer bill for the property. If you have any questions or would like to arrange for direct payments from your checking/savings account, contact the water billing clerk at (815) 943-6468 or at vega@cityofharvard.org.

Water Meter Replacements and Repairs:

Public Works provides maintenance and replacement services for all water meters. Meter repairs and meter replacements will be performed by the City at no cost to the customer. The building owner is responsible for the maintenance and repairs of the plumbing pipe at the meter and to provide working shut off valves at the meter. Many of the older style of water meters require the reading to be taken inside of the home or building. This can be an inconvenience to the property owner, or if no one is home, requires the customer to take their own meter reading and return it to the City. The City offers replacement of those older style water meters, free of charge. A new meter will be installed that includes an outside reading device, which eliminates the need for the City employee to go inside of the building to take the reading.

RECYCLING

Recycling pickup is on the same day as your refuse pickup and we suggest that you use paper grocery bags as additional containers and dividers. Please do not use garbage cans or plastic bags for your recyclable materials. Kindly have your refuse and recyclable items at the curb by 5:30 a.m. on the day of pickup.

These are the items we recycle. You do not have to separate them into individual groups.

•Paper - consists of bagged, twined, boxed, or secured paper including

but not limited to newsprint, magazines, junk mail, magazines, etc.

•Glass Bottles - consists of whole bottles and jars, color mixed and cleaned of all organic material; and free from cooking ware, plate glass, safety glass and non-glass materials.

•Tin steel and bi-metal (steel and aluminum) beverage and food cans. Tin-steel cans must have labels and organics removed.

•Aluminum - consists of aluminum beverage cans.

•Plastic - consists of high density polyethylene (HDPE) plastics and PET plastics 1 and 2, including but not limited to milk jugs, laundry liquid containers and other high density containers.

Items that we do not recycle: tissue paper, aluminum foil, plastic bags, styrofoam, ceramic, china, and light bulbs.

YARD WASTE

Beginning April 1, of each year, and continuing through the first Friday in December, Contractor shall collect Yard Waste material from residences at curbside on a day selected by Contractor and agreed to by City. Material must be placed in paper lawn bags or an approved container with a visible X marked on it. Tree or brush trimmings must be less than five (5) feet in length and weigh less than fifty (50) pounds. Each lawn bag, approved container, or bundle must have a Yard Waste sticker attached to it.

The Harvard Fire Protection District proudly serves the 16,000 residents living within our 108 square mile response area. The district employs 32 part-time personnel who are trained in both firefighting and emergency medicine. In addition to their basic training, several of our members have completed more advanced classes such as vehicle extrication, hazardous materials, and technical rescue. We currently have 3 members staffing our station 24hrs a day through rotating 12-hour shifts bid on by each member. Our headquarters station is located at 502 S. Eastman St. and is the only station located within our district.

As your first responders, we pride ourselves in providing the highest quality of care and rapid emergency response to various types of emergencies. Currently we house 2 engines, 2 tender pumpers, 3 ambulances, 1 brush fire vehicle, 1 UTV, and 2 support vehicles. These vehicles are equipped to handle several different types of emergencies. Some of this equipment includes

the Jaws of Life, grain bin rescue tubes, ropes for repelling/hoisting, ice rescue equipment, specialized heart monitors, and medications to treat a variety of medical emergencies.

While we pride ourselves in emergency response, providing education and prevention to the citizens is one of our highest priorities. We offer several different educational opportunities for our community members. CPR classes can be scheduled for various group sizes and completed at our district headquarters or off site. Along with CPR, we offer age-based fire and injury prevention education. As an example, for children we teach calling 911, stop drop and roll, having a meeting place, and not to play with flammables. For our older residents, we talk about trip and fall protection, fire hazards around the home, and how to prepare for severe weather events. We also offer fire extinguisher training for our local businesses and residents. Visit the Harvard Diggins Public Library and enjoy a warm welcome to the Harvard community's center for learning, creating and imagining. Located in the recreational campus that includes the playground, sledding hill, swimming pool, Food Pantry, Senior Center and Lion's Park, the library offers books, DVD's, CD's, audio books, and magazines for checkout. The library's collection is not limited to print materials only. Digital books, audiobooks, and magazines are available for use on smart phones, tablets and computers with the touch of a finger from the library's website, www.harvard-diggins.org.

Library cardholders may access the library's collection and that of over 130 libraries in the PrairieCat consortium from the library's website 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Cardholders may search the catalog, place requests, and view and renew items checked out. As a member of PrairieCat and the Reaching Across Illinois Library System (RAILS), the library loans and borrows materials from other libraries widely.

Internet service is available on the library's public workstations as well as through the library's wi-fi. A local history area offers information about Harvard and the surrounding communities. Harvard newspapers from the late 1800's to 1986 have been digitized and are available for browsing from the 'Harvard Newspapers' link on the library's website.

The library's newsletter showcases the events and activities offered for all ages. It is available at the library and also on the library's homepage, www.harvard-diggins.org. Most events open to the community are offered at no cost. Quiet study space is available in the library's two study rooms overlooking the wildflower garden. The

larger community meeting room, named the Burbank Room after local artist E.A. Burbank, is the site for most of the library's programming events.

Several special collections are found at the library and may be viewed during regular library hours. An early Harvard resident, Harriet Ayer Towne, gave her extensive butterfly collection to the library in 1918. The collection is housed in the Local History room. Artwork by Harvard's most famous native artist, E. A. Burbank is on permanent display in the Burbank Room. The library also owns a collection of the Harvard Milk Day posters including the original painting for the first Milk Day poster, titled 'Morning Milk' by Daniel Barrett (Daniel Armour).

Harvard Diggins Library is a municipal library and tax money for its support is collected on property within the city limits of Harvard. City of Harvard residents may obtain a library card at no additional cost. Persons living outside the city limits, in a non-taxed area, may purchase a nonresident library card for a fee calculated to reflect the average cost paid by a Harvard family. Both resident and nonresident cards may be used at most public libraries throughout the state of Illinois. Proof of address is required for registration.

If you happen to be near Harvard, Illinois on the first weekend in June, you might find yourself enjoying the annual “Milk Days” celebration. Milk Days is Harvard’s way of honoring the important contributions of the agricultural community and the chance to tell the rest of the world that Harvard is a good place to live. It is a time of revelry, reunions and remembrances. People from all over the area join in the week’s festivities which include a beauty pageant, a talent show, tractor pulls, farm tours, bed races, a special kid’s parade and, of course, the big Milk Day Parade. Family and friends who have left Harvard ‘come home’ for the weekend and family reunions abound. And as the bands march along the “Milky Way,” they trek past streets with names that remember Harvard’s past.

Diggins Street is named for one of the earliest families to settle in Harvard. Wesley Diggins came to this area in 1827, built a log cabin that served as home and trading post, and encouraged other members of his family to join him. An explorer and adventurer at heart, Diggins eventually moved west to California and sold his property to a man named Blackman. A few years later, William Hart bought government land and began to build his homestead. Hart dreamed of developing a small village called “Sumner,” but somehow his plans didn’t work out as well as he expected.

Harvard, as a real town, became a reality primarily because of a man named Elbridge Gerry Ayer. Elbridge Ayer and his wife Mary left their home in Massachusetts and headed west in 1854. In 1855, Mr. Ayer bought four hundred acres of land in the Harvard area. Ayer watched with interest the growth of the railroad. He heard about how William B. Ogden, John Wentworth, George Randolph and others had envisioned Chicago as the greatest city in Illinois and sought to make it so by making it a railway center. In 1856, Ayer and two other railway enthusiasts, John Page and Henry Eastman, mapped out plans for a town and set out to win a contract to build a section of railway between Centerville (which is now Woodstock, Illinois) and the newly incorporated town of Harvard -which was named

after Ayer’s ancestral home. The rail link was part of William Ogden’s Chicago, St. Paul and Fond du Lac Railroad which later became the Chicago and North Western Railroad.

When the Chicago and North Western announced plans to build a routing center in the area, Ayer determined that it should be built in Harvard which then had a population of 250. Ayer, Page and Eastman offered the railroad free land for the routing center in exchange for a stipulation that all passenger trains stop in Harvard. The railroad agreed and Harvard entered its railroad era. The railroad brought many jobs and opportunities. Ayer, for example, built a three-story hotel next to the railroad tracks. The hotel’s dining room could serve 150 people at a time. Ayer’s son, Edward E. Ayer, made his fortune producing railroad ties and became a prominent man in Chicago. By 1880, Harvard had grown to 1600 people. It was the place to buy groceries, clothing, medicine, furniture and tools. By the turn of the century the town bustled with wagon makers, barbers, dentists, doctors, a hospital, two banks, an insurance agency, billiard parlor and saloons. A pickle factory with a 30,000-bushel capacity began operating in 1883 and by 1885 nearly half of the small cheese factories in the county were located in Harvard.

By 1916, the golden age of railroading was fading in the light of rising interest in a newer mode of transportation -the automobile. The railroad diminished in importance, although Harvard residents still rode the Chicago and Northwestern line into Chicago and other towns along the way. By 1927, the gravel road that ran north and south out of Harvard had been cemented over and became Federal Route 14. A former harness shop began selling Maxwell cars and a few years later a Ford dealership opened on Ayer Street. Today Harvard’s business community is a blend of the past and the present.

GREATER HARVARD AREA HISTORICAL SOCIETY

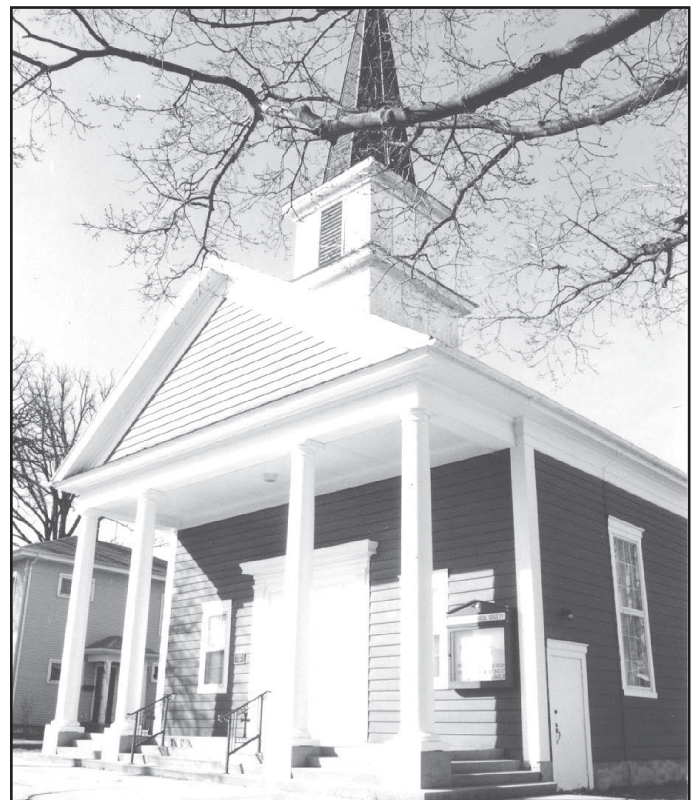
The Greater Harvard Area Historical Society is located at 308 N. Hart St. and was founded in 1978. In 1989, the Society was able to purchase the old St. Paul Lutheran Church building from the Presbyterian Church, enabling the Society to have a permanent home.

Education is a main concern of the Society. Tours for school children and other groups are available throughout the year. Arrangements can be made by calling the museum at (815) 943- 6141, emailing harvardhistoricalsociety@gmail.com, or leaving a message on the Greater Harvard Area Historical Society Facebook page.

Harvard history books are available for purchase at the museum or through museum members. Many other reference books and historical documents are available for research at the museum. Popular special exhibits from the museum collection are Harvard High School class pictures, the history of Milk Day celebrations, Starline products and catalogs, and a variety of antique clothing, farm and household items.

An ongoing mission of the museum is the plaquing of historic sites in the area. The Society is also interested in obtaining Harvard family histories and in seeking out area businesses and farms that have been operating for more than 100 years. The Society is supported by memberships, contributions from businesses, and individual memorials and gifts.

The museum is open from June through October on Sundays from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. or by appointment. Programs on topics from Harvard and area history are held throughout the year.



It's Harvard's unofficial reunion weekend and Illinois' longest continuously running festival

Harvard became the self-proclaimed "Milk Center of the World" when at one time there were as many as seven dairy companies within a 15-mile radius of Harvard. Those dairies produced more milk than anywhere else in the United States.

In the spring of 1942, a local war effort was underway in the Staline area to increase milk and food production for our servicemen in World War II. At a small, civic celebration, which included a gathering of all the folks in the Harvard area, friends and neighbors, both city and farm dwellers, pledged to return a year later during June Dairy Month to renew their efforts to sell war bonds and support this area's war involvement. That gathering now attracts over 100,000 visitors to Harvard over a two-week period in late May and early June.

The community has changed since the street dance and hay wagon days, however Harvard Milk Days still builds itself around a huge parade on Ayer Street. Over the years, world-class athletes to nationally recognized politicians have led the Milk Days Parade. Mickey Mouse, the Budweiser Clydesdales, the Jesse White Tumblers, and many, many more famous people have graced the Milky Way.

While the essence of Harvard Milk Days remains a salute to Americana, and our heritage, Harvard Milk Days is also a huge enterprise. Hundreds

of volunteers work year-round to scout talent for entertainment, contract bands and drum corps for the parade and arrange for new features for the Milk Days festival grounds.

While some events, like the Mini Tractor Pulls and hot air balloon launches, are new, several favorites remain.

Harvard Milk Days' Prince and Princess contest is famous for the crepe paper costumes worn by the contestants. Big Wheel and Bed Races close Ayer Street for hometown fun, and the Milk Drinking Contest hosted by Dean Foods always draws a crowd.

We invite you to take part in all of our activities, whether it is crowning royalty, cheering on your favorite entry in a competitive event, or just to sit in the shade and enjoy our two-hour parade along that famous strip of street known worldwide as the "Milky Way."

Harvard Aquatic Center

The Harvard Aquatic Center is located in Lions Park and is accessible via Brown Street and Galvin Parkway. The pool is open from June to August. The 7,000 sq. ft. pool is a handicapped accessible zero-depth pool with a capacity for 496 people. Features include a water slide, basketball hoop, and a diving board. Shallow end features include a raindrop, tumble buckets, and a tulip shower. Also available is a picnic area, a 5,680 sq. ft bathhouse, and concession stand. Season passes and daily passes are available for purchase in-person or online. The pool is also available for after-hour pool parties. Lions Park

Lions Park is accessible from Galvin Parkway off Route 173 East and from Brown Street. Lions Park includes the Harvard Aquatic Center, McFarlin Field, picnic grounds, playgrounds, a 9-hole disc golf course, a gaga ball pit (ball can be checked out at the library), walking path, two shelters, and restroom facilities. A lighted sledding hill is also available in the winter and is open until 10:00PM during the sledding season. Parking for the sledding hill can be accessed from Harvard Hills Road.



Milky Way Park

Milky Way Park is on Lawrence Road via West Route 173 or West Diggins Street. It includes the 1-acre Harvard Dog Park, soccer fields, baseball and softball diamonds, football fields, an outdoor fitness center, a pedestrian path, a picnic shelter, open field areas, a playground, and restroom facilities. Milky Way Park is the permanent location for Harvard Milk Days.

Northfield Park

Northfield Park is located on Northfield Avenue between 4th Street and 8th Street. It has a playground, two gazebos, walking path, two tennis courts, grassy open space, and restroom facilities.

Moose Athletic Field

Moose Athletic Field is located on West Diggins Street. The park has two baseball diamonds, restrooms, and a concession stand. It is the home of the Harvard Baseball League.

McFarlin Field

McFarlin Field is in Lions Park. It includes three softball diamonds, concession stand, shelter, and restroom facilities. It is home to the Harvard Educational Recreational Softball (H.E.R.S.) league.



Mary D. Ayer Park

Mary D. Ayer Park is located at Park & Washington Streets off Ayer Street and close to Washington School. It includes open field areas, a picnic shelter, a basketball court, and a playground.

Country Brook Park

Country Brook Park is located between Meadow Lane and Stoneycreek Lane. It includes a pedestrian path, open field areas, gazebo, and playground.

Park Pointe Park

Park Pointe Park is accessible from Galvin Parkway via East Route 173. A parking lot is located on Dewey Street. The park offers a walking path, fishing pier, bird watching, and playground equipment.



Shadow Creek North Park

Shadow Creek North Park is located on Casey Lane. The park includes a playground, open field area and a basketball half-court.

Shadow Creek South Park

Shadow Creek South Park is located at the corner of Joanne Lane and Casey Lane. The park includes an open field area and access to a retention pond. No swimming is allowed in the pond.

Park Hours

All parks are open dawn to dusk. Park shelters and athletic fields can be reserved by filling out a reservation form. Contact City Hall at 815-943-6468, visit harvard.recdesk.com, or visit www.cityofharvard.org for more information.

MCHENRY COUNTY CONSERVATION DISTRICT



The McHenry County Conservation District was established by voter referendum in 1971. Its purpose, as defined by state statutes, is three-fold:

Preservation of open space: Over 25,800 acres have been preserved by the District, providing protection for prairies, savannas and wetlands.

Education: Programs and workshops teach children and adults ways to respect and enjoy their natural surroundings. Two popular activities include the Festival of the Sugar Maples at Coral Woods Conservation Area in March and Hooked on Fishing at Rush Creek and The Hollows in June.

Recreation: District sites throughout the county offer a wide range of recreational opportunities, including hiking, horseback riding, permit camping, biking, canoeing, fishing and picnicking.

RUSH CREEK CONSERVATION AREA

20501 McGuire Road, Harvard

726 acres | 2 mile hiking trail

Rush Creek Conservation Area contains a mixture of upland forest, oak and hickory woodlands, wetlands and sedge meadows. A small pond offers anglers a quiet place to fish, and features an almost six-mile long horseback riding loop. Visitors can rent out the picnic shelter for daytime gatherings, or small groups can reserve campsites and sleep under the stars.

BECKS WOODS CONSERVATION AREA

5940 North Pagles Rd, Chemung

283 acres | 0.5 mile hiking trail

The Piscasaw Creek runs through this quiet and peaceful site, making it a perfect location for fishing bluegill, trout and smallmouth bass. It also offers a large group campsite for the opportunity to spend a night in nature.

STONE MILL TRAIL

Lawrence Rd, Harvard/Maxon Rd, Chemung

1.5 mile multi-use trail

The 1.5 mile Stone Mill Trail is a paved multi-use trail taking users from Maxon Road in Chemung, along Ramer Road to Lawrence Road near Milky Way Park in Harvard. Stone Mill Trail connects two rural towns, providing a safe means of travel and an additional recreational opportunity for local residents to walk, bike, or rollerblade.

HIGH POINT CONSERVATION AREA

10250 Reese Road, Harvard

253 acres | 1 mile hiking trail

High Point Conservation Area boasts the highest glaciated point in Illinois at 1,189' above sea level. It offers a mixture of oak and hickory savanna and ephemeral wetlands creating attractive habitat for many bird species. This quiet site provides visitors with an abundance of wildlife viewing opportunities.

The community of Harvard has supported public education since 1859.

CENTRAL SCHOOL

Building Opened in 1888.

Central School was converted in 2011 to District 50's Administrative Offices. Central School now houses all administrative and district-wide functions. The renovation focused on making the building appropriate for administrative office use, while retaining the feel and spirit of the school building that has served generations of Harvard students. The move of the Administrative Offices to Central School fulfilled two promises the district made to the community: 1) to preserve the Central School building and use it for something important and 2) free up space in the High School for additional classrooms.

WASHINGTON SCHOOL

Building opened in 1953

Washington School serves three to five-year-old students in a half-day Pre-K program. At Washington, early intervention is key to future success. The dedicated staff helps children develop the skills and confidence they need to be successful lifelong learners. Teachers work specifically, with a research-based curriculum, to address fine and gross motor skills, language, social/emotional development, and pre-academic skills necessary to be kindergarten ready. Classrooms provide small-group and one-on-one instruction to meet each child's individual needs. In addition, Washington's nationally recognized Parents as Teachers Program currently provides services to families from birth to three years old in Harvard.



JEFFERSON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Building opened in 1954

Jefferson Elementary School educates the district's fourth and fifth graders. Students work to live up to the school pledge: "to do their best and respect self and others and to be proud of self at the end of each day." In addition to a rigorous academic program, teachers provide opportunities for students to build character and feel positive about themselves. Jefferson offers extensive field trips, a STEM lab, reading rallies, a climbing wall, a pond and nature area, team-building events, and attendance competitions. The school is a 1-to-1 student to technology device building. Jefferson is a recognized regional leader in PBIS, earning the highest level of recognition – Platinum. PBIS is a system that encourages positive student behaviors. Jefferson teachers also teach Second Step curriculum. Second Step is a program that supports social-emotional learning.

Students receive instruction in either dual language or monolingual classrooms. Jefferson is a bilingual building. The related service and support staff work closely with students that have special needs. Staff also provide special education services such as resource and self-contained classrooms. Jefferson also offers a homework club.

Jefferson is a great place to learn and grow. Students and staff are proud of the school, its history, their work today, and their future.



RICHARD D. CROSBY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Building opened in 2010

Built in 2010, Richard D. Crosby Elementary School is a two-story, kid-focused building housing the district's kindergarten through third grade classes. Classrooms are uniquely designed to help the children learn in an engaging environment. Crosby has small group areas, 1-to-1 computing, auditorium style reading space, discovery centers, and an expanded library. These areas provide teachers with a variety of learning environments in which to engage their students. Crosby Elementary also provides the community with meeting spaces. The building includes a multi-purpose room and a gymnasium with bleachers and a stage.

At Crosby, teachers implement strategies to encourage student creativity, responsibility, and self-motivation. Beyond learning skills like reading, writing, and math, students study music, learn the importance of physical activity, and develop the social-emotional skills needed for enduring success.



HARVARD JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL

Building Opened in 1962

Harvard Junior High School serves sixth through eighth grade students in a departmentalized setting. The Junior High offers the AVID program, which prepares students for success in high school, college, and a career, especially students traditionally underrepresented in higher education.

To help with the total development of the student, Harvard Junior High offers a variety of classes and activities, including music, sports, student government, art, technology, and extended curriculum. The junior high staff works closely with the high school staff to ensure a smooth transition for eighth grade students into high school.



HARVARD HIGH SCHOOL

Building Opened in 1921

Harvard High School's mission is to prepare 9th-12th grade students for life after high school, no matter where their path takes them.

Harvard High School offers challenging honors courses and an expanding roster of Advanced Placement classes and dual credit classes through MCC. In fact, students may elect to enroll in the District 50 DUO program allowing them to graduate from high school with their associates degree.

The high school also offers robust career and technical education, including internship opportunities at many of the county's manufacturing facilities.

Many activities are offered at the high school to enhance academic instruction. The high school's LINK Crew consists of a group of upperclassmen whose purpose is to mentor incoming freshmen and transfer students. The guidance department helps students obtain financial aid, choose colleges and careers.

Harvard High School competes in the Kishwaukee River Conference. Students can compete in sports, student government, instrumental and choral music, the chess team, and other extracurricular activities. The Hornets have represented themselves well in state competitions, bringing home nine Illinois High School Association state tournament trophies, including two state championships.

THE SPECIAL EDUCATION DISTRICT OF McHENRY COUNTY (SEDOM)

In cooperation with its eleven member school districts, including Harvard Community Unit School District #50, SEDOM is dedicated to allowing each student the educational opportunities necessary to develop to their fullest potential.

Individualized programs are provided in a continuum of services and locations which emphasize placement in the child's home school but which also includes special classes in other schools throughout McHenry County and in a special school environment when such a placement is in the child's best interest. Services are designed to meet the needs of students with cognitive, physical, social/emotional and sensory disabilities. Related services available to children include speech, occupational and physical therapy, as well as health services, psychological and social work support. Adaptive physical education, vocational training and transition planning to postschool opportunities are also provided. SEDOM and member district schools coordinate with private services for children ages 0-2, and services are provided by SEDOM for students ages 3-21

or until graduation. All services are provided free to parents and are provided pursuant to each child's Individualized Educational Program (IEP) in the least restrictive environment.

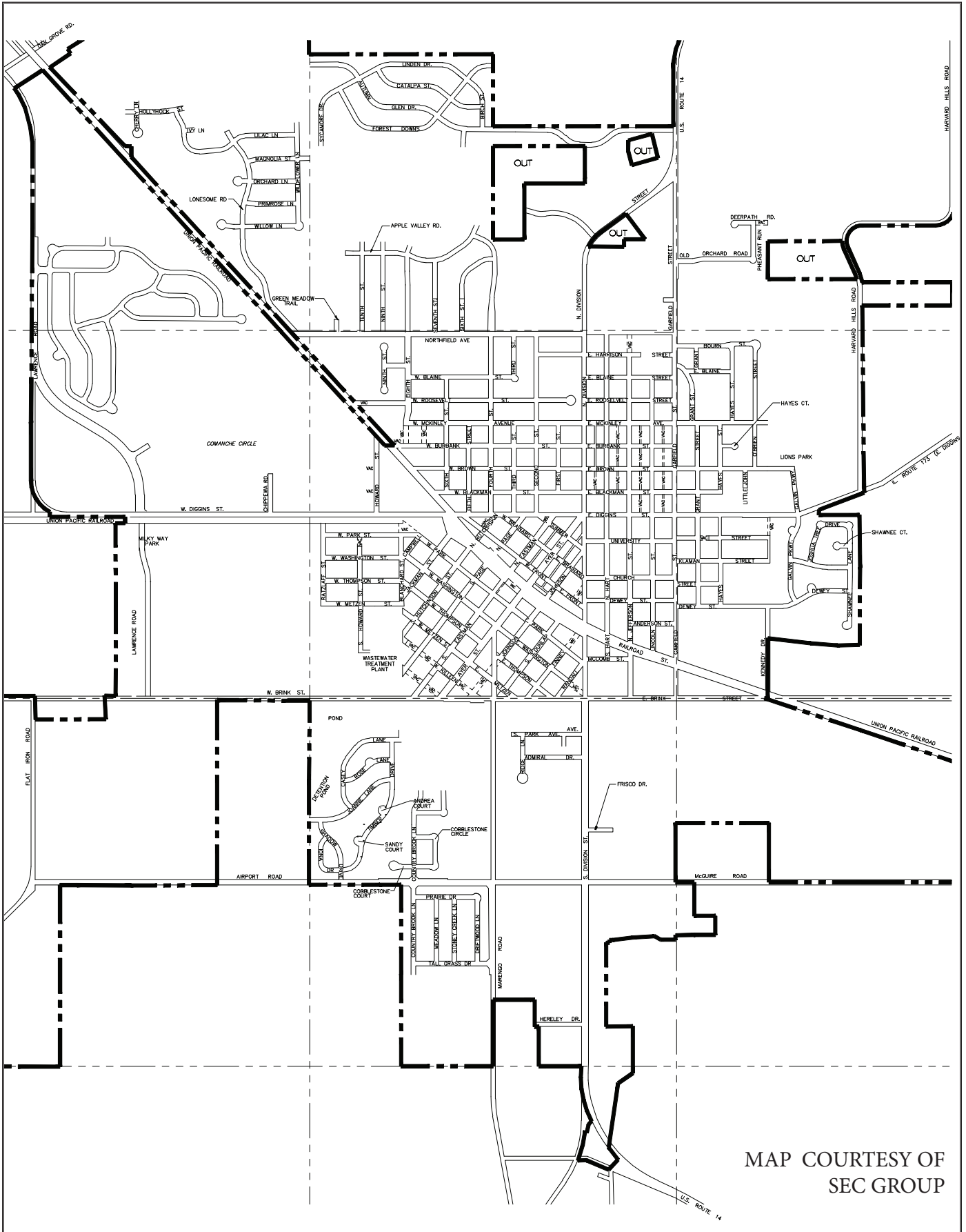
